Crews were divided into teams of three and given a scenario moments before the clock started. The crews mission was to rescue the "hurt-man" from either the utility pole or tree, and perform CPR until rescue teams arrived.

For example if your bill is \$82.73 your bill would be automatically rounded up to \$83 and the additional 27 cents would be directly contributed to Neighbors in Need.
