Stay Warm, Stay Safe: Essential Space Heater Tips for Fall & Winter Our most ductless heating are safe.

As the weather gets colder, portable electric space heaters can be a convenient way to keep your home warm, but they also pose significant fire and electrical hazards if not used properly. Each year, over 65,000 home fires are linked to heating equipment, causing hundreds of deaths, thousands of injuries, and millions in property damage. Space heaters without proper safety features, placed too close to combustibles, or plugged in incorrectly are common fire risks.

To stay safe while using space heaters, follow these important tips:

- · Read the manufacturer's instructions and warning labels carefully.
- · Inspect heaters for damage before each use, and do not use if damaged.
- · Always turn off space heaters when leaving a room or going to sleep.
- · Keep space heaters at least three feet away from flammable materials.
- · Place heaters on flat, stable surfaces away from high-traffic areas.
- Plug heaters directly into a wall outlet, avoiding extension cords or power strips.
- · Unplug and store heaters safely when not in use.
