UNDERSTANDING YOUR BILL: THE SERVICE AVAILABILITY CHARGE

You can think of it as your share in keeping the system strong and ready for everyone. Whether you use a small amount of electricity or a lot, the service availability charge helps make sure the lights come on every time you flip the switch.

At Pend Oreille PUD, we're committed to keeping costs fair while maintaining the reliable power you depend on every hour, every day.







As the temperatures drop and furnaces start running, a few small changes around the house can help keep your energy use, and your bill, in check this winter.

- Let the sun help. Open blinds or curtains during the day to let sunlight naturally warm your home, then close them at night to hold the heat in.
- **Use space heaters safely.** Only heat the room you're in and keep them at least three feet away from anything that can burn.
- Check your filters. Clean or replace furnace filters regularly so your system doesn't have to work harder than it needs to.

These simple steps can go a long way toward keeping your home cozy and your energy costs under control.

To help keep your SmartHub account secure, multi-factor authentication (MFA) is now a voluntary option, which adds an extra layer of protection for your online account.

With MFA, you'll log in using your usual password and then verify your identity with a unique code sent to your phone or email. This makes it much harder for anyone else to access your account, even if they know your password.
