

Stay Back, Stay Alive: What to Do Around Downed Power Lines

Storms and winter weather can bring down trees and power lines. If you see a downed or sagging line, stay far away and call 509-447-3137 immediately to report it.

- Assume every line is energized. Even if it looks harmless, a downed line can be deadly.
- **Do not touch or move it.** Keep children and pets away from the area.
- If a line falls on your vehicle, stay inside, call 911, and wait for help. Only exit if the vehicle catches fire. If that happens, make sure to jump from the vehicle, land on both feet, and shuffle away keeping both feet on the ground.

Your safety comes first. When in doubt, stay back and call us.



Understanding Your Bill: The Kilowatt-Hour Charge

When you turn on a light, watch TV, charge your device, or use your microwave, you're using electricity. The more electricity you use, the higher your bill will be, kind of like when you fill your car with gas. The more you use, the more it costs.

Electricity is measured in something called kilowatt-hours (kWh). That's just a fancy way of saying "how much power you used and for how long."

One kilowatt is the same as 1,000 watts, about what it takes to run a big toaster.

If that toaster runs for one hour, that's one kilowatt-hour.

Pend Oreille PUD charges about 6.6 cents for each kilowatt-hour you use. That means if you use 100 kilowatt-hours, it costs about \$6.60 for that part of your bill.

That's one of the lowest rates in the Pacific Northwest, and it helps cover the cost of making, buying, and delivering electricity to your home, keeping your lights on and your house warm all year long.
